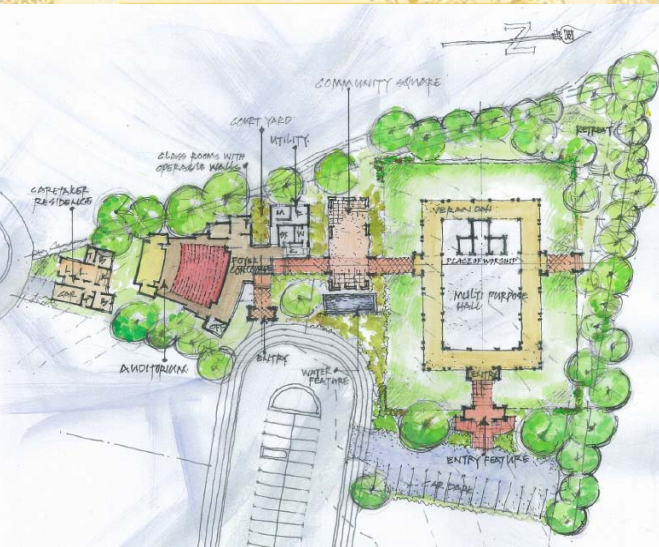


PROGRESS & NEXT STEPS

GCHCA Background

The Gold Coast Hindu community has formed the *Gold Coast Hindu Cultural Association (GCHCA)* to serve the ever increasing cultural, educational and religious needs of South East Queensland. For the past three years, Gold Coast Hindu community members have been congregating at Helensvale Community Centre every third Friday of the month.

Hinduism is an ancient philosophy and a way of life that includes an advanced system of ethics, meaningful rituals, practices, traditions and beliefs. 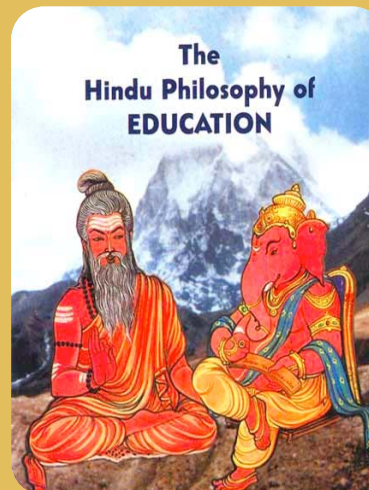
Practice of Hindu culture in Australia is on the increase and the Australian census identifies Hinduism as the fourth largest religion. The GCHCA was founded in 2012 by members from Hindu Community who saw the urgent need to serve and support the cultural, educational, spiritual and moral well-being of the South East Queensland region's rapidly growing Hindu population.

GCHCA Vision

The vision of the GCHCA is to enhance the cultural engagement and religious experience for all in our diverse Hindu community. The association will provide a platform to promote and expand innovative programs in education, youth & adult activities, and service to the community representing a strong Hindu presence.

The GCHCA will promote Hindu culture among the wider community by being inclusive and supportive of friendship, respect, peace and tolerance. In particular, the association will promote and foster Hindu cultural activities such as classical literature, music, dance and classical language & spiritual education by providing resources and facilities at the proposed "Hindu Cultural and Education Centre".

Culture

To promote and foster Hindu culture, the GCHCA will construct and maintain a Hindu cultural & educational centre. The association will provide facilities and conduct regular classes of various performing arts forms, classical dance and literature and also host cultural programs.

Education
